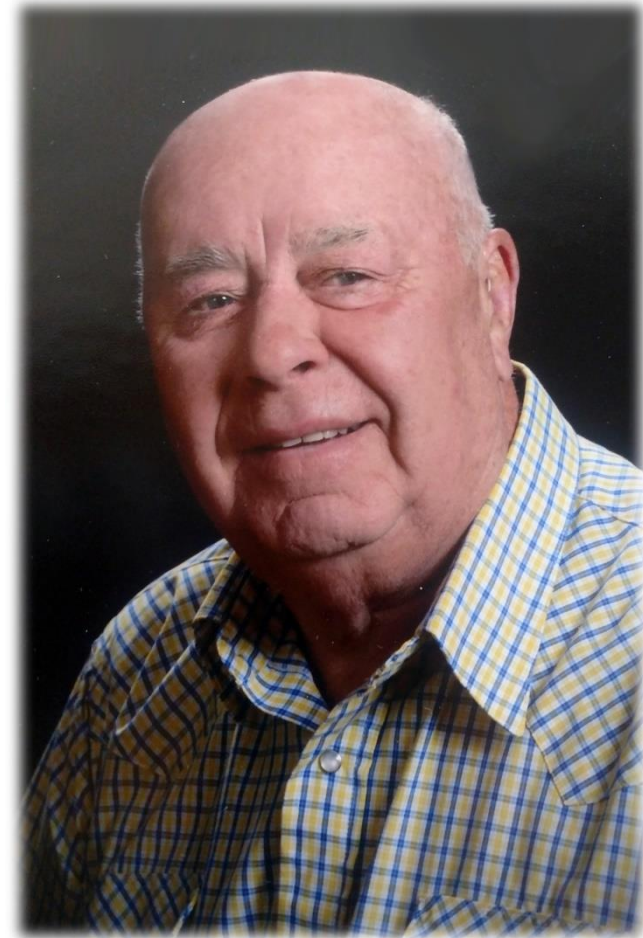

Old dogs, children and (black velvet!) watermelon wine.

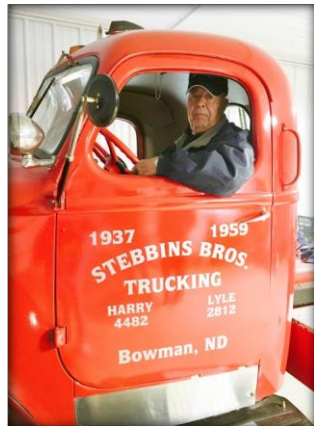

Darwyn Frank Stebbins, 74, Piedmont, died Saturday, December 23, 2017, at his home in Piedmont.

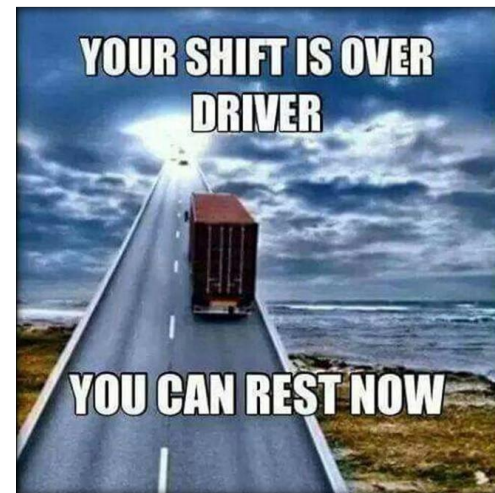
